The Year in Review 1990

Discussions for first school on foreign soil took place late Spring of 1993, as Dr. Bill Basansky met with the AMT board to discuss helping start a Bible College in Ukraine. Board decision was to help and materials began to be put together for a 4 year Bachelor program.

The program was taken to Ukraine in late September and approved by Pastor Yui, who Dr. Basansky had been working with. An opening date of February 2, 1994 was set.

The Year in Review 1994

From 1990 until 1994, Crossroads provided office space for ICBT

January 29 saw a team traveling to Kiev, Ukraine to start a Bible College for young people's training for ministry, with Bro. Roger Price and a team of teachers taking materials to teach. The school opened originally in a teacher's college. School ran two semesters this year.

AMT and Crossroads Bible Church worked with Dr. Bill Basansky and other ministries to see Hospital wing addition.

The Year in Review 1995

School continued in Kiev, Ukraine with Bro. Gary Radcliff as Administrator.

There were Passover services held in 5 churches in Illinois, Kentucky, and Missouri, including Mt. Carmel, Illinois, Morganfield, Kentucky, and Hartford, Kentucky.

Supply ministers from AMT ministered in the spring and summer at Last Days Word Church in Evansville and a Praise and Worship team ministered at the church in Mt. Carmel where Tom Hanzel was pastor.

Foundational Schools opened in Morganfield, Kentucky January 9 where Johnny Blount was the Senior Pastor; in Harrison, Arkansas where Darrell Whorton was Pastor; Poplar Bluff Missouri, where Vernon Wolverton was Pastor.

This fall saw new Foundational Schools start in Mt. Carmel, Illinois (Tom Hanzel pastor), Advance, Missouri (Tony Badami Pastor), and Marion, Kentucky (Robert Jones Pastor).

New Affiliate Schools started this fall in Chicago, Illinois (Dr. William McCoy Pastor), and Akron, Ohio (Dr. Lisa Hunter Pastor).

Baccalaureate Services were held at Crossroads Bible Church, Leo Hall pastor, on August 25. August 26 graduation service was held at Sikeston, Missouri.

The Year In Review 1996

Graduation of the first class of Ukrainians was held in January.

Kay Cunningham started typing at home for office needs. Randy Cunningham began teaching at the Bible School in Hartford, KY.

Connections were made with Don Korach, American Missionary to Costa Rica, and IITB came into being, as Bro. Don took materials for translation into Spanish to Costa Rica.

Schools running this fall included Ft. Myers, Florida, Duwoody, Georgia, Carterville, Chicago (2), Harrisburg, New Haven, Norris City and Mt. Carmel, Illinois, Evansville, Indiana, Hartford and Morganfield Kentucky, Elkton Maryland, Poplar Bluff and Sikeston Missouri.

Passover services were held at many school sites in April.

In the summer, a new AMT Directory was set up listing the Pastors/churches, ministers, and schools networking with AMT.

Cross cultural missionary training classes were held August 1,2, and 5-9 at Crossroads Bible Church with seasoned missionary Gary Manning teaching.

An Alumni Appreciation dinner was held in November.

Pastor Joseph Kamau, of Nakuru, Kenya, visited the ministry in November.

The Year in Review 1997

Missionary Don Korach put the first IIBT school in Costa Rica, opening in February with 80 students. He began the same year to put schools in Colombia, Venezuela, Panama, and Nicaragua.

Mid-year graduation took place with Baccalaureate at Portageville on December 4th, and graduation at Sikeston, Missouri on the 5th with 16 graduates.

By the end of the year, schools in 18 foreign nations were using ICBT materials, with ICBT teaching sites/schools in 12 of the states of the U.S.A.

AMT membership was growing, with members residing in 18 states. There are now over 1,000 persons that are either students or alumni.

Pasha Sagash came to the U.S.A. Home Office from Ukraine, working with Russian translation of ICBT materials.

Fifteen new schools were supplied with ICBT materials in 1999, with AMT office/staff/members making 7 mission trips. New foreign site schools were started in the nations of Nigeria, South Africa, Haiti, Philippines, Malawi and Mexico.

New Schools in the U.S. included St. Paul, Minnesota, with Pastor Lesley Ford.

Graduation was held in Caldwell Missouri for 18 graduates on December 6.

The Year in Review 1998

Passover services were held in the spring at Steel and Cardwell, Missouri, ICBT Norris City, Illinois, and at New Haven, Illinois.

Bro. Tommy Seay took the ICBT materials and opened the Joliet ICBT at the Joliet Correctional Center. Students included 35 inmates and 35 employees of the correctional system. Classes were also taught at a homeless shelter.

King's Word Academy moved to Omaha, Illinois in the fall of 1998. Adult KWA classes were held at Steele, Missouri, Somerset, Pennsylvania, Elkton, Maryland, and Suffolk, Virginia.

Fifteen inmates are now enrolled in the Adult KWA program, at no cost to them. They are incarcerated in

Illinois, Missouri, Florida, and Arkansas.

AMT Fall Conferences were held at Norris City (Pastor Leo Hall) in September, and at Somerset Pennsylvania (Pastor Bill Dodson) in late September.

Updated material was sent to Key Largo, Florida for the school run by Pastor Doug Leedy, and to Kennesaw, Georgia, for the school run by Pastor David Port.

The Year in Review 1999

Materials were now being translated into Mandarin, Chinese.

New schools were started in the Crimea, Haiti, India (2), South Africa, 13 nations of South Western Africa, the Philippines (2), Zimbabwe, and Peru.

The East Coast Conference was held October 1, 2 at Somerset, Pennsylvania. The Midwest AMT Conference was held at Sikeston, Missouri on October 14-16.

IIBT schools in Central/South America continue to grow, with 14 sites in Colombia and 327 students; 18 sites in Nicaragua and 363 students; 1 site in Venezuela and 35 students; 1 site in Panama with 45 students.

By the close of the year there were over 200 inmates studying for a degree with ICBT and there were 30 studying for a high school diploma.

By the end of 1999, approximately half of the teaching materials have been translated into Spanish and about half into Russian. Other languages the materials are being translated into include Mandarin, French, German, Portuguese, Telegu, and Tamil.

New schools in session for the school year '99-'00 include Kennett, Sikeston, and Portageville Missouri, Longmont, Colorado, Owensboro, Kentucky, and Dixmoor, Illinois.

By the end of 1999, from a small beginning in 1990, by the grace and purpose of God, American Mission Teams & International College of Bible Theology ministers, missionaries and teachers have:

- 1. taught over 4,500 students the Word of God;
- 2. established 100 school sites in 30 foreign countries and 48 school sites in 17 states in the U.S;
- 3. researched, written and developed 85 courses in Bible, Theology, and Practical Christian living;
- 4. granted 600 certificates and 650 degrees;
- 5. conducted 9,000 class sessions by 186 teachers in the United States and 8,000 class sessions using 187 teachers, including interpreters, in foreign field schools;
- 6. staff people have traveled 200,000 plus miles in the United States and 703,400 plus miles to other countries;
- 7. ministered in 160 churches and ministries in the United States and 110 in other countries;
- 8. made 5,500 copies of course syllabuses & teaching materials for use in the United States;
- 9. made 100 master sets of course syllabuses & teaching material for use on the foreign field.
- 10. seeded over \$450,000.00 into the Kingdom of God, not including the individual missionaries that are supported separately but that network with AMT-ICBT;
- 11. touched l0s of 1,000s of lives.

In this work, God has been faithful to meet every need, and we give all the glory to Almighty God. This could not have happened nor continue to progress without the generous support and prayers of our members, networkers, and partners. Only God could have caused this unique and awesome ministry to come to fruition. We must remember; some plant, some water and God gives the increase.
